Guidance

Voting by post is an alternative way of voting if you are unable to visit a polling station on polling day or would rather not vote in person.

Postal votes can be sent to addresses in the Isle of Man, UK and overseas. You must be 16 years old or over on polling day and registered on the electoral register to vote. The closing date for postal voting applications is:

If the postal ballot paper is to be marked within the Isle of Man – **16 September 2026**

If the postal ballot paper is to be marked within the British Isles, but outside the Isle of Man – **10 September 2026**

If the postal ballot paper is to be marked overseas (outside the Isle of Man and the British Isles) – **1 September 2026**

Complete every section of the application form, including your date of birth and signature. Your date of birth and signature are needed on this application form, and again when you use your postal vote. We use these details to check your postal vote and help to prevent fraud. Failure to provide the required information in this form may result in the refusal of the application. Further information may be required regarding the identity of the applicant before granting a postal vote. Please complete the form carefully.

You will be sent a postal ballot pack containing two envelopes and some postal voting guidance.

- In the postal voter ballot pack, there will be a postal voting statement and a postal voter ballot paper featuring your unique identification number.
- Envelope 'A' is for the postal voter ballot paper.
- Envelope 'B' is for Envelope 'A' **and** the postal voting statement.
- Envelope B, included in your postal voter ballot pack has a business reply address to which the pack will be returned. **If you are sending it from overseas (outside of the IOM and British Isles) you may need to pay postage.**

If you make a mistake or complete the information incorrectly when completing the postal voter ballot paper or the postal voting statement, this may result in a 'spoilt postal voting statement' or 'spoilt postal vote ballot paper'. If this has happened or if you do not receive a postal voter ballot pack - please contact the Crown and Elections Unit as soon as possible on 685754 or by email to elections@gov.im. **The postal voter ballot pack will not arrive before 2 September 2026.**

When you get your postal ballot pack:

- Complete and return it as soon as possible.
- Follow the guidance to complete the postal voter ballot paper and postal voting statement
- Keep the postal voter ballot pack safe until it is ready to return.

To return your postal vote:

- Take it to the post box yourself if you can.
- Take the ballot pack to a polling station in your constituency and place it in the postal vote ballot box up until 8pm polling day.
- If you can't do that, give it to somebody you know and trust to post it for you.
- Ask someone that you know and trust to place it in the postal vote ballot box at a polling station in your constituency on up until 8 pm on polling day.
- Don't hand it to a candidate.
- Don't leave it where someone else can pick it up.

Privacy Notice

The Cabinet Office collects and processes personal information to fulfil its legal and statutory functions.
